**A. CONFERENCE TRACKS**

**B. TYPES OF SUBMISSION & PUBLICATION**

**1. Abstract Only\***

For all tracks TASTEM, TABLES, TAMA, TAHPER, & CIRCLES. All accepted abstracts will be published in the 2021 IMPS e-proceeding at **no additional cost**. The proceedings will have an e-ISSN and can be accessed online at the conference website after the conference. It should contain 300-400 words (excluding reference list).

**2. Full Paper\*\***

For all tracks: TASTEM, TABLES, TAMA, TAHPER, & CIRCLES. All papers accepted are presented in the parallel session of the respective conference track.

1. Accepted papers on TASTEM, TABLES, TAMA, and TAHPER can be published in the Special Issue of IDE Journal (International Dialogues on Education: Past and Present). IDE-Online Journal is an open-access, peer-reviewed journal on international educational research that publishes current scientific papers, research reports, and book reviews. The journal is indexed in several directories such as Crossref, ERIC, DOAJ, ROAD, SSOAR, EZB, and FIS. All articles include DOIs. IDE is currently working towards indexing with SSCI, the Web of Science. A copy-editing fee of US\$60 will apply if you opt for this publication.
2. Accepted papers on TABLES may opt to be submitted to the partner journals
  - a. [Journal of Language and Literature \(JOLL\)](#) or
  - b. [Journal on Language and Language Teaching \(LLT\)](#)

Authors choosing this journal option will have to follow the respective journal policy and requirements as well as their regular review process.

3. Accepted papers on CIRCLES will be published in the 2021 IMPS e-proceeding with an e-ISSN. They can be accessed online at the conference website after the conference at **no additional cost**.

*Note: If you only want to present and do not intend to publish your full paper in any journal options, choose **Abstract Only\*** submission.*

**3. Poster Abstract/Proposal\*\*\***

Poster Abstract/Proposal is only available for the Student Research Forum. The abstract should contain approximately 150 words stating the problem, method, results, and conclusions.



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### C. SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS & GUIDELINES

#### 1. Submission Checklist

1. A paper submitted has not been previously published nor under consideration for publication in another journal.
2. The paper must follow the submission guidelines. Any other aspects not listed in the guidelines must adhere to APA 7<sup>th</sup> ed. Publication Manual.
3. The submission file must be in a Microsoft Word format
4. There should be two files to submit separately
  1. Title Page (with author details). This page should contain the presentation/paper’s title, authors’ names, affiliations, and email addresses.
  2. Blinded manuscript.
    - a) The main body of the paper should not include any information that allows reviewers to identify the author.
    - b) Author identification should also be removed from the properties for the document file. This step can be done by choosing File > Save As > Tools (or Options if using a Mac) > Security > Remove personal information from file properties on save > Save

#### 2. Style and Formatting

1. The paper must be written in English, containing 2000 – 8000 words.
2. A full paper abstract contains 150-200 words and 3-5 keywords. An abstract only submission should have 300-400 words and 3-5 keywords.
3. Main research article sections must be available, including introduction, literature review, methods, results, conclusions, and references.
4. All citations and references must be accurate and follow APA 7<sup>th</sup> Ed style and format

6. The requirements and guidelines listed in this file are for authors who wish to publish their full paper in [IDE Journal](#). Refer to [IDE Journal Submissions](#) for more information.
7. Full papers for Student Research also follow the submission guidelines in this document.
8. Full papers submitted for presentations in TABLES and to be published in other partner journals must follow the respective journal requirements
